The Summer Marine Science Program has extended the application process, as we still have some open sessions available! Calling all current fifth through seventh graders who love to be outdoors!

Applications can still be downloaded at any time from the website prior to April 19th at http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/marinescience/. The link also will have a complete day by day curriculum for each grade level, parent information, and a video from last year's program.

Return the completed pre application to your child's science teacher who will turn it into the program. Once accepted, a final application will be mailed home within two weeks. Upon payment deposit and final application returned a confirmation of session letter will be mailed.

We currently ONLY have spots available in our third session, June 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, July 1, 2, 3. This is a perfect session to finish just before the Independence Day holiday. Small classes of 12-14 students are separated by grade level. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field with students kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, snorkeling, sailing, windsurfing, surfing, SUP, (stand up paddleboarding), etc.

Counselor Corner



We pride ourselves on doing our part to insure that Palencia Elementary School is a place where all children can learn and grow surrounded by caring and knowledgeable adults. However, the reality of the world is that children come to us from all walks of life with varied experiences, abilities and skills. Not all children know what to do when they experience situations that interfere with their ability to fully engage in learning and social activities at school.

By discussing some of these issues that concern us as parents, we hope to offer some information, resources and strategies that can be helpful. Today's topic has to do with bullying. With so much in the news regarding children being bullied at school, some parents have shared that they worry about their child's physical and emotional safety at school. It seems timely to let you know what we are doing to keep your child safe and bully-free. District definition of bullying:

Our school district policy defines bullying as systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress. Incidents of bullying are always taken seriously and procedures have been put in place to identify, report and follow up to insure our children are safe at school.

Definition of Bullying Behaviors:

For behaviors to be labeled as bullying, all three of the following components must be present:

The behavior is repeated, the behavior is intentional (done on purpose with the intent to cause hurt or harm), there is an imbalance of power (you feel like you cannot make it stop)

Bullying is further defined as unwanted and repeated written, verbal, or physical behavior, including any threatening, insulting, or dehumanizing gesture, by an adult or student, that is severe or pervasive enough to create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive educational environment; cause discomfort or humiliation; or unreasonably interfere with the individual's school performance or participation.

What Bullying Is Not:

Bullying is not a disagreement or conflict. Even best of friends often have misunderstandings and disagreements. Such situations can be usually be worked through by sharing each other's views. (This a different set of skills needed and is a topic for future counselor corner articles and classroom lessons.)

Incidents of Bullying are always teachable opportunities to help our children learn new skills:

- *The child being bullied needs to learn assertiveness skills, where to go and who to talk to when they are feeling bullied. They can expect to be listened to and respected. At school the child should talk to their teacher, the school counselor Mrs. Tiffany Ellis, Principal Goodrich, Assistant Principal Mehanna, or any other school personnel they trust.
- *The bully needs to learn social skills, tolerance of others who are different, respect and how to make and keep friends.
- *The bystanders: Need to feel empowered to step in and help when witnessing incidents of bullying, how to identify ways they can safely intervene and leadership skills.

What we are doing at Palencia Elementary School:

- *Reports of bullying are always investigated and taken very seriously. District policies and reporting guidelines and protocols are followed and reported to the district.
- *All school personal are trained to identify bullying behavior and intervene when they see incidents of bullying.
- *Our teachers are incorporating social/emotional skills into their curriculum and/or class meetings.
- *Our school counselor, Mrs. Ellis, has developed classroom guidance lesson plans to teach character counts and friendship skills as needed. She also does small group and individual guidance as needed. The counselor is often involved when bullying is reported to be a part to the solution by teaching new skills. She has a link on the Palencia Elementary school website to "Bullying Prevention Resources for educators and families".
- *The morning news show is now featuring one minute words of wisdom each morning addressing the character pillars and behaviors that empower our children to be able to 'do the right thing even when no one is looking!'

Thank you for taking the time to read this counselor corner article. The next article will discuss ideas for helping you help your child to feel safe at school. Remember, it is only by working together that we can create a school where all of our children can reach their highest academic and social potential!


