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February AR Challenge – I Love a Series

In order to accommodate all ages and reading levels, this challenge has two options. If the student reads a book with 50 or less pages, then they need to read 4 books. If the books are 50 or more pages then you need to read 3 books in the series to meet the challenge. To qualify for the challenge, students must read within their ZPD (reading range set by STAR Test) and pass the AR tests with a 70% or higher. Teachers will use a short form to sign-off on the student's successful completion of the challenge. Finally, students can come to the media center to pick up their reward. Students will have their names announced on WPES and be given an "I Love a Series" Brag Tag.
