The Palencia ship continues to sail along smoothly with 532 students now on board. We will be adding three associate teachers to our crew very soon!

Technology: Our digital textbooks are now fully operational. Teachers initially accessed the text on their laptops for projection to the class as a whole. As of Sept. 10th, though, students have been able to access their textbooks on their iPads. iPads are shared by pairs of students, which works well as they collaborate and learn together as well as individually. Student Leadership: All teachers spent time in the first weeks of school introducing students to Covey's Seven Habits of Leadership. We are now seeing that leadership in action with our Student Leader program for 4th and 5th graders. <u>Safety Leaders</u> are now on duty at our entrances, hallways, and cafeteria as well as on our buses. Our <u>Green Team</u>, which will provide the school with more awareness and information about recycling and other environmentally important topics, had their first meeting yesterday. More student leadership groups, such as <u>News Crew</u>, <u>Yearbook Team</u>, and <u>Student Mentors</u>, will start soon.

Interims: For this quarter only, we will not be sending home an interim report. We are still in the process of gathering data on your children. We will be scheduling individual conferences for parents in the next month or so. If you have questions before this time, please contact your child's teacher.

Volunteering & Visiting classrooms: We love our volunteers, but please arrange with your child's teacher in advance to volunteer or schedule a visit. Drop-in visits in the morning during the arrival period are not permitted.

Halloween: At the September SAC meeting, it was decided that PES students will have the opportunity to dress as Pirates on October 31st (provided they stay within district dress code requirements). Other costumes will need to be reserved for trick-or-treating events in your neighborhoods.

Technology Update

We are in full swing now with students using their iPads to access the text-books in class. In addition, students are using the online apps for educational activities and practice. It is amazing to see 2nd graders e-mailing their assignments to their teachers already. These digital natives learn to use these tools so quickly!

Did you know that you can access all of your student's textbooks from home? Your child's teacher will send you home directions (if he/she hasn't done so already) with your child's user name and password. The Pearson online books

are available on both Mac and PC formats. You must have Flash on your computer to access some of the features of the text on:

If you have an iPad tablet or smart phone, the Pearson books are available on an app you can find by searching "Pearson etext."

For now, we are keeping the student iPads at school. Your child's homework should not require that they use

this online tool for homework. We are also not allowing students to bring their personal tablets to school at this time.

Dear Wondering,

We have fruit juice 75c and bottled water 60c for sale, but students will need to be sure they have funds in their accounts for the items. I no longer have the option (per the State Department) of providing students with an alternative choice of drink as a part of their meal unless the allergy or intolerance is "LIFE THREATENING" . (New Meal Patterns that passed in Congress this Spring)

Gifted Screening


