SUMMER MARINE SCIENCE PROGRAM

Applications for the summer Marine Science Program will be passed out by science teachers at all schools during the week of February 11th. Applications will be due back to science teachers by March 5th. Applications can also be downloaded at any time from the website prior to April 12th at http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/ and click on the Marine Science link. The link also will have a complete day by day curriculum for each grade level, parent information, and a video from last year's program.

This summer program is available to all students currently in grades five through seven and has been sponsored by the school district since 1982. Three eight day sessions are held at Gamble Rogers Middle School with bus transportation provided. The dates for the three sessions this summer will be May 29st through June 7th, June 10th through June 20th, and June 24th through July 3rd. Small classes of 12-14 students are separated by grade level. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field with students kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, snorkeling, sailing, windsurfing, surfing, SUP, (stand up paddleboarding), etc. Specific grade level activities and curriculum are attached to the applications and are also available from the website.

Why is character important? Your character is made up of your basic beliefs which drive your choices that in turn, drive your actions. Your character is what will sustain you in times of crisis and allow you to participate in fulfilling your life's dreams.

Why should we instill the character pillars qualities in our children? Because we want our children to develop the life skills and values that will guide them through the choices, challenges and opportunities that lie ahead. "The present and future of well-being of our society requires an involved, caring citizenry with good moral character."**

During the month of March, our Character Pillar emphasis is TRUSTWORTHINESS. A trustworthy person is someone who can be relied upon to be honest, truthful, reliable, dependable, credible and safe. The ideal of trustworthiness embodies the values of integrity, honesty, reliability and loyalty. Being trustworthy is the foundation of all human relationships and an important social skill. When we learn trustworthiness we find the courage to do the right thing for the right reasons and we learn how good it feels to be trusted by others.

As parents, my husband and I totally realized that these are the qualities we wanted our children to possess and would be needed throughout their lives. However, I must admit that I neglected to realize that the responsibility for the learning of these traits was ours!

How easy it is to get so caught up in a frustrating situation and punish rather than use the situation as a 'teachable moment'! What were we thinking?! How could we possibly expect the children to figure out how to navigate the complications of playground, school and social scenes on their own? It would be easy to leave this training up to the schools or churches to provide the lessons and engage our children in groups where they were forced to play 'nicely' with other children. It didn't take me long to figure out that children cannot teach these skills to themselves! The responsibility of instilling desirable character traits for my children rests within my family (with the help of schools, churches and family and friends.)

Here are a few tips that I have learned along the parenting journey that are helpful to keep in mind:

- *Children are not born knowing what 'playing nice' means. It takes someone who is willing to take the time to have conversations about what 'being nice' looks like, feels like and provide opportunities to practice 'nice' behaviors. Children learn trustworthy behaviors when you take the time to model, point out trustworthy behaviors and allow them to practice in a safe and loving environment.
- *When your child is dishonest or unreliable, be willing to take the time to use the action (or lack of action) as a teachable moment. Sometimes enforcing a thoughtful consequence with love is the best teacher.
- *Be honest with your children and let them see and hear you being honest.
- *Don't ask your children to lie for you.
- *Encourage your child to be honest even when it may cause your child to get into trouble.
- *Teach your children what to do when someone asks them to do something they know is wrong. (It takes courage to say "No" to friends or members of a desired social group.)
- *Make it a point to be on time.
- *Do what you say you will do.
- *Keep your promises




