#### SUMMER MARINE SCIENCE PROGRAM, SPOTS ARE STILL AVAILABLE!

The Summer Marine Science Program has extended the application process, as we still have some open sessions available! Calling all current fifth through seventh graders who love to be outdoors!

Applications can still be downloaded at any time from the website prior to April 19<sup>th</sup> at <a href="http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/marinescience/">http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/marinescience/</a>. The link also will have a complete day by day curriculum for each grade level, parent information, and a video from last year's program.

Return the completed pre application to your child's science teacher who will turn it into the program. Once accepted, a final application will be mailed home within two weeks. Upon payment deposit and final application returned a confirmation of session letter will be mailed.

We currently ONLY have spots available in our third session, June 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, July 1, 2, 3. This is a perfect session to finish just before the Independence Day holiday. Small classes of 12-14 students are separated by grade level. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field with students kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, snorkeling, sailing, windsurfing, surfing, SUP, (stand up paddleboarding), etc.

# Counselor Corner



#### HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD DEAL WITH ADVERSITY WITH PEERS


We would like to think that unkind and hurtful behaviors do not go on in our school. We would also like to think that our children have the skills and self confidence to stick up for themselves and others. However, these behaviors are learned behaviors and children need us to teach them how to negotiate social situations positively. Elementary school offers a variety of opportunities for children to both experience and experiment with social strategies.

Imagine this situation which could occur at any school at recess: Shilo, Timmy and Ollie have all taken their snacks to the play-ground during recess. Shilo decides that Timmy's gummy bears would be much better than the smushed crackers in his backpack and demands that Timmy turn the gummies over to him. Shilo has a reputation of getting what he wants by hitting, kicking, name calling and other aggressive behaviors. Timmy passively gives in to Shilo's demands and hands over the requested gummy bears. Ollie overhears the conversation and walks over to the twosome and encourages Timmy to keep his snack and tell Shilo "No!", and invites Timmy to join him and others in a game of kick ball.

As parents, it is painful to watch your child withdraw when they really just want to make friends and do the right thing. It is equally as painful to hear that your child is the one being mean or hurtful. All parents want their children to develop assertive communication skills that will empower their children to stand up for themselves in a way that is respectful to themselves and others. Here are a few tips to help nurture your child's assertive skills.

- \*Create a supportive and accepting environment that promotes positive communication between you and your child. Let your child know that you are available to listen to whatever they feel is important to tell you and no topic is 'off limits'! You might want to practice the 'I'm not shocked by this' look in the mirror. If your facial expressions and body language is interpreted by the child as disapproving, they won't share!
- \*Use 'teachable moments' by discussing and role playing situations with your child before they occur. "What would you do if \_\_\_\_\_\_?". Take advantage of teachable moments when you observe such situations in movies or favorite TV shows to discuss positive and negative ways others solve social issues.
- \*When situations do occur, be there to help your child process emotions, separate out the facts and problem solve. When you take the time to listen to the whole story and empathize, your child will know that you do understand how difficult this is for them.
- \*A good place to start problem solving is to ask what strategies they have tried or thought of trying? You might suggest additional strategies that other kids have used to solve a conflict with a peer. (This lets your child know that other kids have had the same problem and have found solutions.)
  - \*Talk to the teacher or another trusted adult. Reassure them that telling an adult is not tattling! Once the teacher is made aware of the situation he/she can make changes in the classroom setting and make sure that unfavorable interactions are minimized.
  - \*Encourage your child to implement the buddy system and surround themselves with friends. Teach her that she doesn't have to put up with 'friends' who are mean.
  - \*Teach your child to walk away from a bad situation calmly, rather than letting the aggressor get a reaction out them. This tactic does not mean the situation should be ignored, as all incidents should be reported and dealt with, but it does give a sense of power back to your child.
  - \*Stick close to trusted adults and stay in supervised areas.
  - \*Use of positive self-talk to build confidence (A true bully will tend to prey on people they perceive as being weaker).
  - \*Some parents and children think that retaliation is a good way to deal with conflicts, however, fighting back usually results in getting in trouble or hurt.
- \*Remember that you are helping your child develop patterns that will be the foundations of adult social skills. The Timmys end up as victims, the Shilos end up hurting those that care for them and the Ollie's become self-reliant creators of their own futures. You are the teacher and role model! Your children are watching and learning from you!
- \*If you have additional concerns about what is happening at school do not hesitate to let us know what is happening. Know that at Palencia Elementary our principal, guidance counselor, teachers, and staff take reports of bullying very seriously. When we are made aware of an adverse situation, we will investigate, reach out to the parents for continued communication, and develop a plan, going forward, for the particular concern. We are committed to providing a safe learning environment for all our children!
