As this school year is winding down and students are participating in FSA and i-Ready testing, daily schedules might be a little different for our students. Change in schedules and routines can be difficult for everyone, so it is important to be flexible this time of year. Please encourage your children to be open to change, encourage positive behavior in school, and to continue to work hard as we close out another amazing school year.

You may have received a message from the district last Thursday stating that certain district tests have been cancelled due to difficulties with the online server. This cancellation does not affect our FSA testing or our i-Ready testing, so these tests will proceed as planned. For elementary schools, it will affect the Resource (art, music, and PE) End of Course Assessment for 4th and 5th grade. If these students were unable to complete this assessment or missed the test, they will not be expected to complete it based upon the decision made by the district. As for the i-Ready and FSA assessments, proctors are still needed. Please consider signing up, even if for only one day. Every time a proctor signs up, the proctor will be entered into a raffle drawing for a \$50 gift card. The more you proctor, the greater your chance of winning! Counselor Corner



Occasionally someone shares something I wished I had read and saved to pull out at just the right moment. This is one of those emails that was forwarded to me by a good friend that was helpful for her. You and your child may not need this now, but perhaps you will be able to find it if you ever need it:

A young woman and her mom were in the kitchen talking about life while making cookies. The daughter shared with her mom about her life and how things were so hard for her. She did not know how she was going to make it and just wanted to give up. She was tired of fighting and struggling. It seemed as one problem was solved a new one arose.

The mom pulled out three pots and filled them each with water. In the first she placed carrots, the second she placed eggs and in the last she placed ground coffee beans. She let them sit and boil without saying a word about what she was doing as they continued their conversation. In about twenty minutes she turned off the burners. She ladled out the carrots, eggs and coffee into separate bowls. Turning to her daughter, she asked "Tell me what do you see?" "Carrots, eggs and coffee." she replied. The mother pushed the bowl of carrots towards her daughter and asked her to feel the carrots. The daughter noted that they felt soft. She then asked her daughter to take an egg and break it. After pulling off the shell, the daughter observed the hard-boiled egg. Finally the mother asked her daughter to sip the coffee. The daughter smiled as she tasted its rich aroma. The daughter then asked, 'What's the point?"

The mother explained that each of these objects had faced the same adversity—boiling water— but each reacted differently. The carrot went in strong, hard and unrelenting. However, after being subjected to the boiling water, it softened and became weak. The egg had been fragile. Its thin outer shell had protected its liquid interior. But, after sitting through the boiling water, its insides became hardened. The ground coffee beans were unique. After they were in the boiling water, they had changed the water. "Which are you?" She asked the daughter. "When adversity knocks on your door, how do you respond? Are you a carrot, an egg or a coffee bean?"

Think of this: Which am I? Am I the carrot that seems strong, but with pain and adversity, do I wilt and become soft and lose my strength? Am I the egg that starts with a malleable heart, but changes with the heat? Did I have a fluid spirit, but after a death, a breakup, a financial hardship, or some other trial, have I become hardened and stiff? Does my shell look the same on the outside, but on the inside am I bitter and tough with a stiff spirit and a hardened heart? Or, am I like the coffee bean? The coffee bean actually changes the hot water, the very circumstance that bring the pain. When the water gets hot, it releases the fragrance and flavor.

If you are like the bean, when things are at their worst, you get better and begin to search for solutions to change the situation around you. When the hours are the darkest and trials are their greatest, do you elevate to another level? How do you handle adversity? ARE YOU A CARROT, AN EGG OR A COFFEE BEAN?
