The 'Alert Now' automated phone message service is another primary way in which we will communicate. Please know that we try very hard to only use this system when it is absolutely necessary. The goal is for our families to listen to this when you hear that is it us. The other area we would like to address is the school vision and mission statement. Our staff survey showed the same results. We have begun the process of refining this and will continue to do so during the upcoming year. We have received a hydroponic garden that is ready for assembly. We would like to have this up and ready for the start of the new year. The system needs some cleaning before it can be used. Scheduled FCAT testing was completed today. Our students did well and we will be eagerly awaiting the results. Results for third grade should arrive just prior to the end of the school year. Subsequently, fourth and fifth grade results will arrive during the summer. Scores will be available for pick up or online once they have been released. Each student will be given a code to check scores online.

We are continuing to do make-up testing so we will continue to keep the school under testing conditions. Once this is complete we will send another email out to families letting you know that we are open for volunteers once again. Thank you all so much for your support and cooperation during this time.
