THE CAPTAIN'S LOG

Ahoy Palencia passengers and crew,

As we approach the end of the school year there are many activities to be aware of, this week is no exception. Here are some important reminders:

One more event reminder is the Community Connections Meetings hosted by School Board Members. Attached to this newsletter is a flyer with more information and the dates for these meetings.

We have made a little change to help with the students that live in Las Calinas and Kennsington. We have added supervision points to help students all the way through the gate leading to the field. Our goal is to remind students to walk bikes through this area and then go directly home. As a reminder all students must wear a helmet when riding a bicycle. Any student not wearing a helmet will be asked to walk their bike all the way home.

Construction began today on some of the fences around the school. The biggest change will be seen around the Palencia / Avilla bike rack. This fence is for the protection of our students and additional safety of the bikes that are stored there during the day. We understand that this will cause an inconvenience on rainy days dropping off or picking up bikes. There is a gate that is being installed for parent use only. We will unlock the gate for parents to drop off and pick up bikes on rainy days.

The weather has been wonderful lately and it is only getting warmer as we head into the summer months. Please help your students remember the dress code as they prepare for school. A couple of things to remember are that shorts are to be no more than 4" above the knee (a good rule of thumb is that they should be fingertip length when the arms are held to the side), tops must cover the shoulder. If you have any questions please refer to the <u>Student Code of Conduct</u> page 13. Shoes should be safe for all types of physical activities. Even if P.E. is not scheduled for that day, classes go out to recess on a daily basis.

We have sent an Alert Now to our 3rd – 5th grades to go into the Home Access Center (HAC) and update the Student information. Please be sure to do this, even if there are no changes there are a couple of "clicks" to be done so we know it has been updated.

K through 2nd grade students need to return the Student Information Sheet that was sent home. It is very important that we have updated information on all our students. If you have any questions or need assistance please contact Cindy Williams at 547-4017.

SUMMER MARINE SCIENCE PROGRAM Pre-applications for the summer Marine Science Program were sent to all elementary and middle schools in the district to be passed out during the week of February 23rd. However, if your child did not receive a pre-application, they may still apply. You can download a pre-application, get all parent information, and view a video of the program by going to the Gamble Rogers Middle School website and clicking on the Marine Science link. Any questions can be answered by emailing John Gordon at john.gordon@stjohns.k12.fl.us.

This summer program is available to all students currently in grades five through eight and has been sponsored by the school district since 1982. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

Three 8 day sessions are held at Gamble Rogers Middle School School with bus transportation provided. The three sessions are June 8th to June 18th, June 22nd to July 2nd, and July 6th to July 16th. Small classes of 12 – 14 students are separated by grade level.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field. Students access various marine environments while kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, biking, snorkeling, surfing, windsurfing, sailing, and SUP's (stand up paddleboards).

If your child is selected for the program, a final application form will be mailed out from the district office in April.
