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Data Collection: Over the past few weeks, teachers have given students two different on-line assessments for diagnostic and formative information. One test was Discovery Education's **Think Link** assessment. This test, similar to the FCAT assessment, is used district-wide to determine students current performance level on grade-level benchmarks. It will be given two more times this year to gauge student progress and will be used as part of the annual evaluation for teachers in Kindergarten through third grade. (FCAT results are used as the performance measure for teachers in grades 4 and 5.)

The second test given was the Renaissance Learning's STAR assessment. This assessment is a wonderful diagnostic tool for our teachers and gives them prescriptive information to assist in developing individualized learning paths for all of our students. Neither of these assessments are used for "grading" or report card purposes.




