THE CAPTAIN'S LOG

Pirate VIPS: We have a lot to be proud of here at Palencia Elementary but one of our most important "treasures" is our fabulous PTO board. With your help, this group of 21 proactive and dedicated individuals has accomplished so much in our first nine weeks of school. Here are just SOME of their activities...

They incorporated as a PTO, wrote bylaws, developed a financial budget and a master calendar for the year. They solicited 32 corporate sponsorships along with 9 in-kind sponsors—who have donated \$30,600 to Palencia Elementary. They created a web site, established Facebook and Twitter accounts, sent out email blasts and contribute regular articles to the Palencia Press, Pirate Post, and World Gold Village. They collaborated with Nease HS to produce a music video: "I'm a Pirate and I Know It." They organized homeroom moms, got volunteers for the cafeteria, and established the Helping Hands group. They started a Playground campaign, organized a clothing drive, collected and counted box tops. Last, but not least, they coordinated a 4-day Grand Opening that raised \$11,792 and a Pancake dinner that raised \$3000. PTO gave over \$7000 to teachers for their classrooms, donated \$500 each to the Green Team and Coach Brougham's Mileage Club and purchased Composting bins for the future garden. Thank you PTO for your incredible support!

Cafeteria News

Your child's school day just got healthier! School lunches now include more fruits, vegetables, and whole grain-rich foods; only fat-free or low-fat milk; "right-size" meals with portions designed for a child's age; and less saturated fat, trans fat and sodium. The changes in school meals, the first in 15 years, are based on the latest nutritional guidelines.

Here are some important facts about the new school meals:

- The new school lunch provides 1/3 of the *average* daily calorie needs for kids by age.
- Some highly active students, like athletes, may need more calories. Some schools may offer second helpings of fruits and vegetables. A second carton of milk may also be an option. Schools can also operate afterschool snack and supper programs. Students and/or sports teams can also bring food from home
- In practice, many students are being served the same amounts of protein as before under the new standards.

Your child can learn good habits for life by making healthy food choices and getting proper exercise now. This year is a transition year as schools implement these new standards and work together with parents to ensure that every child in every community across America has access to healthy and nutritious meals. Encourage your child to try new foods and to eat the healthy food offered at school. Reinforce healthy eating by offering similar new foods at home.
