The Hardship Transfer application process will begin on FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 15TH, the new application will be live on the St. Johns County School District website: www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/depts/os/schoolserv/transfers.

If you have a child here at Palencia on an approved 2012-13 Out of Zone Hardship, this waiver will expire at the end of this school year. If you would like for your child to still attend Palencia next year and you are on an Out of Zone waiver you must apply again for the 2013-14 school year.
