The first nine weeks report cards were sent home today, Tuesday, October 24th. Please remember to sign and return the report card envelope. There are many ways to support your student's learning and it's never too early or too late to start. One of the most natural ways to build your child's vocabulary and critical thinking skills is through 2-way conversations as the family goes about day-to-day routines. For example, "Who do you predict will win this week's football game? Why do you think ____ will win?" The young learner may answer with a general response such as "Because they are good." and the adult could elaborate with something along the lines of "Yes, their quarterback is very accurate and thinks quickly under pressure." With this response, the adult has naturally modeled elaboration with details, and richer vocabulary.

Literacy in the K-2 Classroom

Upon walking into any K-2 classroom at Palencia Elementary School, you will surely notice literacy learning tailored to meet the individual needs of each PES pirate student. Differentiated instruction uses ongoing assessment and flexible grouping to ensure that each child receives the best learning experience possible. In the primary grade classroom, our teachers are using Wilson Fundations to provide a structured, multisensory approach to teaching reading, spelling, and handwriting, both in the whole group and in small groups. Students develop a toolbox of strategies that can be used to decode and blend sounds to read words fluently. Students can then apply their phonics decoding skills to read decodable texts, which help to promote comprehension and build their confidence as a reader.

For students who are awaiting their turn in the small group, skills-based practice is valuable through both collaborative interactions and independent application . Lexia Core5 also offers adaptive computer-based practice of skills at the student's individual level. Most importantly, our youngest pirates are continually growing as readers as they settle in and enjoy their favorite books, poems, and stories! It's always a great day to be a pirate!

Small group instruction provides reteaching and enrichment opportunities so that each student receives exactly what he or she needs to be a successful reader and writer. Students "tap out" sounds and manipulate letter tiles to learn in engaging ways using multiple senses.
