



The New Worlds Reading Initiative was brought about by the Florida Legislature beginning in July, 2021. The goal of the program is to aid families with information and free grade level appropriate books for students who are below grade level in reading. The initiative hit some early bumps in the road, as local school districts were asked to support the launch without funding.

Over this last summer, regional partners were identified to apply for grant funding to extend the reach of the New Worlds program into local communities. INK was awarded the grant to be the regional partner for St. Johns County.

We are hosting our FIRST EVENT on Thursday evening, November 30<sup>th</sup> in the Nocatee area. The event will be held at The Link, 425 Town Plaza Avenue, Ponte Vedra (32081), beginning with dinner and activities at 6:00pm. The event will conclude by 7:30pm.

We are asking for your help in getting the word out to families with VPK – 5<sup>th</sup> grade students who are currently below grade level in reading based on FAST assessment results.

The event will include:

- Free books for each student attending
- Dinner will be served for each person pre-registered for the event (adults and children)
- Volunteers will host book reading circles for the students while parents/adults learn more about the New Worlds Reading Initiative

• Adults will have an opportunity to apply for their student to qualify for the program, receiving free books delivered directly to their home, along with other tools for parents to aid in their student's growth The event capacity will be 200 attendees, including all adults and children

Two stipends paid by INK are available for each Media Specialist

- Promote the event (\$75 if your school has at least 5 families pre-register to attend)
- Attend the event (an additional \$50)

I will be sending a digital flyer out on Monday to each school that can be used to promote the event. The flyer will include a link for online registration. Additionally, I will send a short blurb that can be used in an email or newsletter to get the information out to the target audience in your school.

We look forward to working with you and your families, with the ultimate goal of reducing the number of our students below grade level in reading! As a former middle school math teacher, I know what a difference having solid reading skills early can make in the academic success of our children-
