Hello, Pirate Families!

My name is Gretchen Molina. I am so glad to be teaching music at Palencia Elementary School! I have really enjoyed meeting all the wonderful students and staff here. Everyone has been so welcoming and encouraging. My family and I recently moved to Palm Coast, Florida, after selling our lake home in Northern Wisconsin. We loved living on the lake, but it is, unfortunately, frozen for about 5 months of the year and we really don't like the cold weather or ice fishing. We have wanted to live somewhere that is warm, sunny, and snow-free with plenty of water and outdoor activities nearby, so that is how we chose Palm Coast. My husband and I have three children – two are in college and one is in 7th grade. We also have a mini-golden doodle. I love to sing, play the piano, and listen to all types of music. My favorite thing to do is spend time with my family - especially outdoors hiking, fishing, and sightseeing. We are loving Florida life so far!

I hold two degrees from the University of Wisconsin - Bachelor of Music Education and Bachelor of Science – Elementary Education. In Wisconsin, I taught elementary music, as well as middle and high school choir at a rural 4K-12 public school, where my own children attended. Though it was a very small school, I am proud to say that our music department was highly accomplished and well-known in the area for musical excellence and fun, memorable performances. Some of the things we have been working on here in the music classroom include singing using solfege, reading music notation and playing rhythms using various classroom instruments, learning about how to follow a music score, and lots more. Something I love about the music classroom here is that there are a lot of instruments for students to play. Several classes have recently had some fun playing rhythms on a non-traditional instrument – the bucket drum! I am looking forward to a fantastic rest of the school year here.




