

What an Angry Child * Needs to Hear *

Do you ever find yourself caught off guard by your child's sudden outbursts of anger?

It's like a storm brewing out of nowhere, leaving you powerless and unsure how to respond. **But don't lose hope just yet.**

Remember that what your child really needs is to feel 'connected' with you again, even if it takes them a little time to let the anger work through them.



Try these phrases the next time your child is feeling angry:

"I can see this is hard for you."

- Tells the child they have your attention.
- Acknowledges the child expressing their feelings.

"I care about how you feel."

- Tells the child that you are present.
- Acknowledges the child's feelings.
- Demonstrates compassion.
- Creates a deeper connection.

"Its OK to feel angry."

- Tells the child that all feelings are ok.
- Acknowledges the child's feelings.
- Gives the child acceptance of feeling angry.

"I am here for you."

- Tells the child that you are present with them in that moment.
- Demonstrates compassion.
- Deepens connection and builds trust.

"I will stay with you."

- Tells the child that you will not leave them.
- Creates a safe environment.
- Deepens connection and builds trust.
- Demonstrates resilience e and patience.

"Even when you feel your worst, I love you."

- Tells the child that you will love them, no matter how they feel or behave.
- Creates a safe environment.
- Deepens connection and builds trust.
- Demonstrates unconditional love.

By approaching your child's anger with empathy and understanding, you can turn those tense moments into opportunities for connection and growth.

Remember, it's not about avoiding conflict but navigating it in a way that strengthens your relationship with your child.

On Thursday, March 28, 2024, our fourth and fifth grade students representing their individual class presented 4H Speeches at Palencia's Florida 4H Speaking Contest. This program is underwritten by the Florida Power and Light and coordinated locally by the St. Johns County 4H program. Every student in fourth and fifth grade choose a topic, researched, organized, practiced, and presented the speech to their class. The winners advanced to the school contest and the school winner advanced to the district contest.

Each student's speech was judged both on composition and presentation. In the composition element, the judges evaluated the originality and uniqueness of the student's choice of material, as well as considering if it captured the audience's attention and if the body of the speech was logical. In the presentation element, the judges evaluated whether the students established and maintained eye contact and if the delivery was fluent, smooth, and easily understandable.



- Our school district releases these emails in batches, so it may take up to two weeks for you to receive yours.

- RSV's submitted with a YES can be placed in a classroom

5th grade students heading to middle school – must include

• <u>Proof Of Residency documentation</u>. Once POR is verified by the elementary school, your student's file will be released to the middle school.

Other families that must provide proof of residency:

- Families with notarized Verification of Residency forms
- If your current lease expires on or before August 2024
- Any student transferring from one school to another






