- SIP for 2023-2024
 - School Advisory Council- sole body responsible for final decision making at the school relating to implementation of the following FL statutes:
 - Implement SIP and Accountability- SIP, early warning system, (students who may be at risk for underperforming related to academics, absences or more)public disclosure (SIP is a public document,
 - Implementation of state system of school improvement and education accountability. (The money that we receive can only be given from the state if we have a SAC.
 - SIP based on data- much data not available until end of the year, and SIP is due in the very beginning of each school year. Goals may already be determined, but strategies to reach goals are important to discuss.

- Four Areas of focus for the PES SIP this year.

Each member was given an opportunity to address 2 questions for each of these areas by using sticky notes. 1- What does the focus area mean to you 2- What are your questions or wonderings about them. (It was decided to go over one of these questions at each of the next SAC meetings.)

- Instructional Practice specifically related to benchmark aligned instruction. Teacher clarity of learning standards and outcomes, common formative and summative assessments, enrichment, or remediation.
 - What can administration do to help teachers? We will go to teachers to have this question answered.
 - What are the best resources for remediation and enrichment? Curriculum and curriculum maps have been updated and remediation and enrichment is built in. (Especially in math). District has provided a list for tools remediation and enrichment.
 - Are there ways for parents to help out with learning at home? Some grade levels send curriculum based letters in the beginning of each topics. QR codes on math practice pages offer guidance.
 - This may not make sense to a non-educator. Even for our educators, we all have to really have conversations to figure out what it says. BEST standards are new. As teachers we want to make sure that we understand the standards, use formative data (quick check in, discussion, checklist) and are gatherin summative data (end of unit mastery).
 - Are all teachers provided the same instructional materials to teach the same unit? Yes, but we are people and we all teach differently. Different classes work different ways, teachers need to know their students. End goal is the same for everyone, but the way we get there might not be the same. (You can't franchise student learning like we franchise burgers).
 - This discussion will be continued, and we will use this to further plan SAC agendas. We will also get deeper into the following three areas of focus in the future:
 - Transformational Leadership- Instructional practice specifically related to PLC
 - Positive Culture specifically related to student character thru CC
 and PBIS
 - ESSA subgroup specifically relating to students with disabilities
