FOR THE LOVE OF May 2024 LITERACY

The pirate ship decks have been buzzing with excitement as the 2023-2024 school year wraps up with end-of-year class parties, kickball tournaments, and kindergarten water day. Our rising sixth grade students have celebrated the end of an era, the much-anticipated transition from elementary school to middle school. As you are looking forward to lazy summer days and a freedom that only summer break can offer, be ever mindful of the phenomenon known as the "summer slide."*

According to research, the summer slide can be attributed to a decline in academic learning gains. In some cases, students lose, on average, 20% of their school-year gains in reading and 27% of their learning gains in math during summer break.* Younger children are at a greater risk for learning loss due to their crucial stage of development. So what can you do to prevent the gains your child and his/her teacher have worked so hard to achieve? Begin by reading with your child every day. Talk about the books they are reading and encourage them to think deeper about what they are reading. For extra excitement, set up a cozy reading nook or tent and make it special!

Help your child become engaged with some of the fun, structured activities listed below.

CREATE A BOOK WISH LIST

Summer reading is a critical way to prevent learning loss. Create a list of books your child would like to read. Encourage reading every day and celebrate as each book is finished.

VISIT THE LOCAL LIBRARY

Many local libraries and book stores have summer reading programs and enrichment activities that encourage young readers to continue reading over the summer. Children are more inspired to read when they self-select books tailored to their own interests and reading levels.

TAKE A FIELD TRIP!

On those hot, steamy summer days, spend some time indoors at a museum, planetarium, or historical site. These realworld encounters will develop cultural understanding and critical thinking skills.

FAMILY GAME NIGHT

Engagement with games and puzzles build vocabulary knowledge and develop math skills. Incorporate family game night into your summer schedule and limit screen time. You will be making special memories with your child in the process!



Greetings from the Music Room!

The second semester in the music classroom has been full of music making and new learning experiences for students. Here are some of the skills we have focused on for the different grade levels:

Kindergarten and 1st grade worked on improving music listening skills by listening and responding with movement to "The Carnival of the Animals" by French composer, Camille Saint-Saens . The music features different instruments of the orchestra. A favorite from the piece was the movement called "Introduction and Royal March of the Lions"! Students also explored playing several different percussion instruments, such as tambourines, hand drums, wooden frog scrapers, and triangles to accompany several different songs.

All 2nd grade classes worked very hard to prepare a wonderful musical production called *Squirm: A Wiggly, Giggly, Squiggly Musical* by John Jacobson and John Higgins. We had fun learning some American sign language to go with our songs and we appreciate the parent volunteers who helped us with that. Everyone did a fantastic job performing the show on May 16th for an audience of students in the morning and another audience of families and friends in the evening. Bravo, 2nd graders!!

3rd graders learned and practiced singing and playing different dynamic markings in a song called, "Volcano!" They also learned a fun partner rhythm stick routine to an old folk song, "Sarasponda". Most recently, they've been learning about harmony through listening, singing, and playing xylophones on the song, "Lean on Me" by Bill Withers.

4th graders have been practicing their recorder playing skills and have learned notes B, A, G, and E. We have also practiced playing Low C, D, F, and High C. Students have found that some notes are more difficult to play correctly than others, but they are learning the proper technique to practice getting those notes to have a nice tone. Most recently, we have played a game called "Recorder Baseball". It has helped students improve their skills of reading and playing notes as they appear on the staff.

5th graders also worked on the same recorder playing skills and music literacy throughout the second semester and made improvements that will help prepare them for middle school music ensembles. For the last couple of weeks, students have had some beginner ukulele lessons, as well! We ordered a set of soprano ukuleles for the music classroom! It's been a lot of fun for everyone, and I hope many of them decide to continue with the ukulele beyond this year. They are fairly inexpensive and a great instrument to play on your own, with a friend, or in a group.

Shout out to the 5th grade Music Enrichment Group who performed at the Night of the Arts on April 23rd. They sang and played their recorders for an audience that evening and I was so proud of how well they did! Bravo!!

• <u>Proof Of Residency documentation</u>. Once POR is verified by the elementary school, your student's file will be released to the middle school.

Other families that must provide proof of residency:

- Families with notarized Verification of Residency forms
- If your current lease expires on or before August 2024
- Any student transferring from one school to another


