We are officially half-way through the school year! Please remember to have your kiddos dressed in weather appropriate clothing and keep them home if they are not well! Continue to notify myself or teachers of any medical changes or limitations your student may have.

As of November 1st I am no longer in the clinic on Mondays and Fridays due to taking on a second peds nursing job. During that time a SJCSD float nurse covers the clinic. If you have any questions about this, you may contact me via email during school hours. <u>shaeria.stokes@stjohns.k12.fl.us</u>

Several reasons to exclude sick children from school:

1. The child does not feel well enough to participate comfortably in usual activities, such as with extreme signs of tiredness or fatigue, unexplained irritability or persistent crying.

2. The child requires more care than the school staff can provide without affecting the health and safety of the other children.

3. The illness is on the list of symptoms/illness for which exclusion is recommended.

The list of illnesses/symptoms is on our school website, it states guidelines and recommendations for exclusion from school due to sickness. Children with minor illness do not be excluded unless one or more of the following illnesses/ symptoms exists.

These guidelines, along with other medical forms can be found on the PES website under the "Departments --> Health Clinic" tab.

Talk to your healthcare provider about flu and COVID-19 if your child has symptoms, a positive test, or is exposed from a household member. You may also visit <u>https://www.cdc.gov</u> for additional information.





Happy New Year Pirates! A few reminders from your Front Office for the second half of our school year:

• Front Office Hours are 7:55 am to 3:45 pm

• Attendance matters! Missing a day of school here and there may not seem like much, but absences add up! When a student misses 2 days a month, they will miss 20 days a year. They will miss 30 hours of math and 60 hours of reading and writing over the school year. They will miss over 1 year of school by graduation.

• Absence Reporting: A written note or email is needed within 48 hours of returning to school stating the cause of the absence. You <u>do not need to call the school</u> to report this, but you may email the teacher to arrange for school work your child has missed. Our Attendance Form is located on the home page of the Palencia Elementary School website.

• Dismissal Changes: If your Pirate is going home a different way or leaving early please complete our Dismissal Change Form located on the home page of our website. We cannot accept phone calls for these changes. We do not send children to the Front Office until you have arrived and shown your Photo ID to staff. All Dismissal changes must be submitted by 2 pm (1 pm on Wednesdays).

• For the safety of students, children may not be checked out of school after 2:15 pm (1:15 pm on Wednesdays).

• Proper identification must be presented each time a person signs in at a school. The only forms of proper identification are the following:

- 1. Current state issued driver's license
- 2. Current state issued identification card (issued only by the DMV)

• We are happy to accept forgotten water bottles, lunch boxes and other items your Pirate forgot at home. Please label items with student's name and teacher.

• Please label your student's items such as water bottles, lunch boxes, and jackets. We will return labeled items to students should they misplace them. If items are not labeled they are placed in our Lost and Found. At the end of the quarter all unclaimed items are donated.
