## **Threat Management Model**

- The goal of the threat management team is to identify and assess situations before they become a threat.
- Each threat management team must consist of a school administrator (Mrs. Cooper) and an expert in counseling, which could be a school guidance counselor, a school psychologist, and a school resource officer.
- Everyone on the team must have an 8-hour training as well as follow-up training each year.
- Each threat will be reviewed, and appropriate actions will take place.
- Threats can be unfounded, low, medium, and high. Most of the threats at Palencia are found to be a low-level.

- There is a website that helps train parents on how to talk with their children on this topic and it will be sent out to our parents.
- It is important to monitor your child's use of technology and social media. Even if an
  incident happens at home if it gets brought into the school, the school is required to
  get involved.
- Mrs. Goodrich reviewed some of the measures that have been in place to ensure safety at our school.
- PTO has requested that Mike Strausbaugh come out for another presentation.
