Hello Pirates! We had a great first week. If I have not had a chance to meet you just yet, I am the new Front Desk Clerk. My name s Nicole Holland, I have lived in St. Johns County for the past four years. The thing I love most about the area is the sense of community. I have three grown children and two grandsons. This past week has been amazing to see all of your children excited to come to school. I look forward to getting to know all of you over the school year.

Just a few important reminders from the front office staff:

- Please label EVERYTHING (water bottles, lunchboxes, backpacks, jackets, etc) with your student's first and last name. That way, if it ends up in the lost and found, we can return the item.
- Please be sure you are approved for school access. If you are not sure, please call the Front Office and we can confirm it for you. We have a new check-in system for volunteers this year. It is called Raptor. Please sign in when you come to visit or volunteer at the two iPads. You will need to scan your driver's license front and then back. Once the system recognizes you, your badge will print at the front office. We will hand you the badge and you must wear it to be on campus. When you are leaving make sure you check out the iPad at the front office as well. You will select sign out and scan the badge bar code. Please hand in your badge when you check out. • Please remember to bring a photo ID with you whenever you visit the school and if you are checking your student out early. We must verify ID every time. We do not send children to the front office for early dismissal until you have arrived and show your photo ID to the Front Office staff.

We also have a new bus tracking app this year called Chipmunk. Here is the link https://www.mychipmunkapp.com/planning.htm.

For the safety of all students, children may **not be checked out of school after 2:15 pm on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, or Friday and 1:15 on Wednesday.**

If you have a change in the way your student will be going home, please complete a Dismissal Change Form. The form can be found on the Palencia Elementary School website. Dismissal changes can only be accepted before 2:00pm (1:00pm on Wednesdays). We cannot accept these changes by phone. They must be submitted in writing by a parent or guardian.

If your student is absent, please complete an Attendance Form, also found on the PES website. Please refer to the district Attendance Policy: https://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/student/attendance/ if you have questions or need more information about attendance.

Please be sure your student has everything they need before they leave for school (backpack, lunchbox, water bottle etc.) and when they exit the car if dropping them off. Although we do not mind taking forgotten items, it is disruptive to the classroom to have items delivered. Thank you.



RAINY DAY DISMISSAL

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR OUR BIKERS AND WALKERS

What is a Rainy-Day Dismissal?

When radar indicates lightening or dangerous weather in our area, PES will not allow our Bikers and Walkers to leave the building. Our priority is always the safety of all our students and that is paramount when these decisions are made. **Please note that rain alone does not warrant a Rainy-Day Dismissal.**

How do I pickup my Biker and Walker in the event of a Rainy-Day Dismissal?

All Bikers and Walkers will be dismissed to their designated Parent Pickup line. (i.e. Palencia Bikers/ Walkers will go to Palencia Parent Pickup and Kensington Bikers/Walkers will go to Kensington Parent Pickup.) Please have your Student's Car Tag hanging on your review mirror while in the parent pickup line. If you need a car tag, please call the front office at 904.547.4010. We will be happy to issue one to you after verifying your photo ID.

How will I be notified if today is a Rainy-Day Dismissal?

Assessment News

Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (F.A.S.T.)

Welcome back, Pirate families! As we begin a new school year, our Palencia Elementary School students are completing their first progress monitoring for the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (F.A.S.T.). Progress monitoring "check-ins" will be implemented three times per year (fall, winter, and spring) to inform instruction and monitor student growth towards mastery of the Florida B.E.S.T. standards in reading and math.

- Grades K-2 will be assessed using STAR assessments in Early Literacy, Reading and Mathematics.
- Grades 3-5 will be assessed using Cambium Assessment for Reading and Mathematics.

These adaptive, computer-based assessments will provide Parent Reports for both math and reading. Scale scores measure what a student has mastered and estimates the skills to work on next.

It is important to understand that these scores provide only one picture of your child's progress in school. Compare the information provided in Parent Reports with what the teacher knows about your child's daily performance. After each Progress Monitoring (PM) window, the Parent Report will be updated. You can compare the scores from each Progress Monitoring assessment to evaluate student growth.

Accessing the Family Portal



Results from FAST administrations will be available in the Family Portal. You will access the Family Portal at https://fl-familyportal.cambiumast.com/#/ and you will be required to enter three pieces of information for security:

Your student's first name exactly as it appears on official school records.


Your student's date of birth.

Your student's unique 6-digit code

To locate the unique code for your student, please log-in to the Home Access Center (HAC) and click on the Registration tab. The code will be located on the right side of the page under the section for Additional Information.

These results are for informational purposes only and should be used to identify areas that may need additional instruction and support. It is important for teachers and families to understand that PM1 score information is intended to provide baseline results; after your student participates in PM2 and PM3, you will be able to track the progress your student made throughout the school year.

My main and most important focus this school year, as it is every year, is the safety of all students.

In light of keeping everyone safe, please make sure your pirates are wearing their helmets to and from school when riding their bicycle or scooter. Not wearing a helmet will result in not being able to ride. Let's all work together in keeping everyone safe.

I have provided below an insert Florida State Statue as it pertains to wearing helmets when operating any man powered vehicle.

316.2065 Bicycle regulations.—

- (1) Every person propelling a vehicle by human power has all of the rights and all of the duties applicable to the driver of any other vehicle under this chapter, except as to special regulations in this chapter, and except as to provisions of this chapter which by their nature can have no application.
- (d) A bicycle rider or passenger who is under 16 years of age must wear a bicycle helmet that is properly fitted and is fastened securely upon the passenger's head by a strap and that meets the federal safety standard for bicycle helmets.
- (8) No parent of any minor child and no guardian of any minor ward may authorize or knowingly permit any such minor child or ward to violate any of the provisions of this section.

Lastly, please adhere to the signage posted at the exit of the parking lot and be advised that left turns are prohibited during the following times:

Monday - Friday 8:00am -8:30am

Wednesday - 1:45pm-2:20pm

Monday - Friday 2:45pm- 3:20pm

A MESSAGE FROM THE NURSE

WELCOME BACK

Deciding when to keep your child home from school can be difficult. When a child is sick and needs to stay at home, parents should contact the school and describe the illness and symptoms. If a medical provider makes a specific diagnosis (such as strep throat, conjunctivitis, chicken pox, etc.), let school staff know.

Several reasons to exclude sick children from school:

The child does not feel well enough to participate comfortably in usual activities, such as with extreme signs of tiredness or fatigue, unexplained irritability or persistent crying.

The child requires more care than the school staff can provide without affecting the health and safety of the other children.

The illness is on the list of symptoms or illness for which exclusion is recommended.

The child is not vaccinated due to medical or religious reasons and there is an outbreak in the school.

The list of illnesses/symptoms is on our school website, it states guidelines and recommendations for exclusion from school due to sickness. Children with minor illness do not be excluded unless one or more of the following illnesses/ symptoms exists.

These guidelines, along with other medical forms can be found on the PES website under the "Departments --> Health Clinic" tab. Please always make sure you have correct medication forms and students' medication is in its original packaging before bringing medication in.

Please fill out the absence form online anytime your child is absent from school with an illness or provide a doctors note upon returning. Please see link below for online attendance form and these forms can also be found on the PES website.




