Hello PES families,

Happy 2026! I hope each of you had a remarkable holiday season and are feeling confident about your personal goals for the year ahead.

The second nine-weeks report cards were available on January 15th. Have you had an opportunity to review your child's grades with him/her yet? Entering the third nine-week period of the school year is special and enjoyable, because teachers and students are now established and comfortable within their "class families". The students know this year's teacher(s) expectations, they know that their teachers care, and they feel prideful when they reflect on how they've grown academically since August. (Psst – Parents, if you have not done so already, be sure to point this growth and achievement out to your little one as you review report cards together.) This all sets the stage for the final two "acts", if you will, of the school year. This is a critically important time of the school year. Increasingly difficult academic standards are introduced, and previously taught academic standards are solidified. This is also the time of year I ask teachers to identify any student who may be in jeopardy of being retained for the 26-27 school year. If, in the weeks ahead, your student is identified, the teacher will contact you directly for a conference. There is still time for school and home to work together to develop a plan to remediate deficiencies during the remaining four months of this school year.

That said, January is historically referred to as "cold and flu season". Please continue to remind your children about the importance of handwashing, eating nutritious foods, and getting a good night's sleep. As a school, we have increased cleaning protocols and are sensitive to the fact that student illness ends up meaning missed days of school. Be sure to connect with your child's teacher to ensure there is a plan for make up work and make up testing. Your student's success and being caught up is important to us!

While we are talking about school absences, I respectfully ask that every effort be made to plan family vacations during school holidays to avoid students missing school. Each day of school is significant, and it is simply not possible to replicate in-person instruction from one of our teachers, through a worksheet packet sent home. (Did you know there is a 4-day weekend in February and spring break week is only a month behind that? Yay!)

There is a lot happening at PES. Keep reading!



👩 Nurse's Corner: Staying Healthy & Warm

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As we move through the winter months, we are seeing a significant increase in flu-like illnesses among both our students and our staff. To keep our classrooms healthy and our doors open, we need your partnership in monitoring your child's health daily.

🤒 Health & Safety First

We understand that missed work and disrupted schedules are difficult, but sending a child to school who is "under the weather" puts our entire school community—including teachers and high-risk students—at risk. Please keep your child home if they are exhibiting: high fever or chills; any rash that is open and not healing; a persistent cough or sore throat; unusual fatigue or body aches; vomiting or diarrhea.

Please find our official Illness Guidelines on the school website under the departments and health clinic tab. These outline specific symptoms and the required "wait times" (such as being fever-free without medication for 24 hours) before your child can safely return to class.

🧥 Winter Weather Reminder

The temperatures have dropped, but we still aim to get the students outside for fresh air and movement whenever possible. We have noticed many students arriving without adequate winter gear. To keep your child comfortable and warm during recess and transitions, please ensure they come to school with: A heavy winter coat. Gloves or mittens. A hat or hood. Appropriate footwear.
