- **Update from Captain Goodrich**

- Goodwill collection continues- We earn money from this collection, and it has been extended to allow families time to add more items to meet our goal.
- Proctors- Parents cannot proctor in same grade as the grade their child is in; navigating how proctor's sign up has been challenging since some proctors may not have access to Parent Square signups.

- The live event auction was cancelled due to lack of interest. (Twenty-two reservations were made but fifty was the minimum needed for the venue.)
