  - **SAC bylaws 25-26**- passed out by Michael Clark to each attendee. We will vote on these bylaws at the September meeting.
- Items for review:
  - PLC conference debrief- presentation by Mrs. Downs & Mrs. Weber- left conference energized! "Good is the enemy of Great"; set expectation for all- get away from low engagement and disengagement- include parents in goal setting; Fluent Reading Strategies; Miles on the Tongue; Read aloud everywhere; Reading and Writing go hand in hand & include writing in all subjects; partner work is key; color code writing
  - SJCSD ELA Textbook Adoption (Mrs. Cooper)- This happens every five years- narrowed it down to set resources; they can be reviewed by the community on **Edcredible**; a team is formed to review the resources and share input to make recommendations. She is looking for interested individuals. (Email Mrs. Cooper.) P.E. curriculum is also up for adoption. Questions were asked about Foundations- not sure what will happen with this since it was an add on program. Parents and teachers both saw benefits from Foundations.
  - SAC Required Training #1-Voting & Membership- we follow The Sunshine Law; SAC member responsibilities; SAC Activities; Establishing a Quorum 50% must be in attendance; SAC membership composition; 51% of membership must be made of parents, students, and community members

- School Grade Data from PM 3 scores 2024-2025 school year presented, explained in detail by Mrs. Goodrich- math will be our focus to help close the gap- lots of great discussion between parents, teachers, and administration; focus will be the Learning Gains
- SIP for 2025-2026- The **School Improvement Plan (SIP)** provides schools and Local Educational Agencies (LEAS) the opportunity to identify the academic and priority goals along with strategies for each school.

Three areas of focus for PES SIP this year-

- SIP- Goal #1- Positive Culture & Environment- Palencia Ahoy Matey chart, PBIS (positive behaviors and intervention support) Matey Money offered; school store; drawing  
Increase the emphasis on the Character Counts! Program and utilize established common school-wide expectations for behavior aligned to the principals and practices of PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and supports) with a goal on reduction in student referrals and ISS/OSS consequences.
- Goal #2- Instructional Practice-Math-promote shared responsibility for all learners through the analysis of data and sharing of instructional strategies within collaborative teams to improve learning gains in Math for our lowest 25% with a goal of increasing 11 percent from May 2025 to May 2026.
- Goal #3 Progress of SWD (students with Disabilities) Subgroup.... (Math) Utilize progress monitoring tools and programs to assess effectiveness of instruction, adjusting as needed to reach a goal of 5-10% increase in the number of students at or above math expectations from May 2025 to May 2026.

- Update from Principal Goodrich
  - Our student number has decreased this year.
  - There are 21 students in 3 of 4 Kindergarten (K) classes and we have been approved to get a 5<sup>th</sup> K teacher. A new class will be formed from the existing classes.
  - How can we boost participation for our curriculum chats so that families receive important information?
